We have extension activities like NSS & NCC. So because of these factors, percentage of intake students (% of girl students is more) & passing percentage is also increased.
- ii) **Weakness:** More number of students are from rural area and majority of them are from Kannada medium. They require communication skill programs.
- iii) **Challenges:** There are six (6) degree colleges in Basavakalyan, even though we are striving very hard to impart value added quality education for rural students.

- iii) Three PG Courses (MA English, MA History and M.Sc Mathematics) are to be introduced.
